Chairman's Chatter

Oh dear, I am beginning to think I ought to change the title of this column to "Chairman's Chastisement", because on looking back at previous articles it seems I am always trying to press members into action. This month things are no different as we have a marked lack of response to our approaches to individuals to commit to observing at the forthcoming Star Group Trial on 13th December.

Years ago an individual would join a club and stay loyal to that club for years, riding in a few closed to club events or practices but the trials events he or she would enter would be in the main centre organised and run by the clubs in turn. When it came to your own club to run an event you were required to offer your services as observer.

Nowadays things have changed. Many of our members will belong to more than one club. This may be because they are comfortable riding closed to club events but like to pick and choose venues, or it might be because they ride in other disciplines, such as long-distance trial or motocross. Entries have changed as well, entry on the day giving great flexibility but less security for the organising club.

We have tried to be as flexible as possible. We don't insist members observe and we now permit our own members to ride in the centre events we run if they provide an observer or if we have covered the observer requirement, something that never used to be allowed. But we remain committed to the ACU Star Group events and to the AMCA South Coast Series as through these two leagues our members have access to a much greater range of venues and experience than we could offer as a single club. This is vital if members are going to improve and progress, certainly access our younger and aspiring riders need.

The Old Codger Trial was cancelled last year largely because there seemed to be no enthusiasm for manning the sections even with payment offered to observers. Its future is still under discussion. As a pre 67 trial this has little impact on the bulk of the membership other than loss of income to the Club if the event attracted a good entry. The inability to remain in either the Star Group or South Coast Trials Series will have a much greater impact and if we are to avoid this we must have your support.

Please ring Peter and offer your services for the Star Group Trial on 13th December. You do not need experience; if you can mark your own punch card you can observe. You will find the day enjoyable and educational - it's surprising the different styles you will see at all levels of competition. If you can observe with a partner then this may make things easier and more companionable. The Club will also give you a voucher for a drink and a burger! Go on - ring today and make Pete's day! 01883 370045.

Sunday 18th October: Hoggin' The Bridge

We were going eventually to Chepstow in Wales for the 10th annual Hoggin' The Bridge which is a charity fund raising event organised annually on the 3rd Sunday in October by the Harley Davidson 'Riders of Bridgewater' chapter. It is great fun and open to all motorcyclists.

As predicted by the weatherman it was warmer and sunny by the time we got to Membury Services on the M4 for coffee and then positivley lovely at the Aust (Severn View) Services on the M48 from where the procession started this year. Over the years it has started at different services, gone over different bridges and finished in different towns. But this time, like last year, we rode over the Severn Bridge, on a short stretch of motorway which was good as it spread us all out a bit, and then along country roads lined with happy well wishers, a bit like the verteran car run - (no jokes about the age of the Harley or me
