Club Trial at Blacklands Farm

This venue, which was recently used for the South Coast Group trial, features a rock bottomed stream with steep banks on either side. This feature provides the rare opportunity to ride over rocks in the South East, and the chance for riders to get their feet wet.

The bright but chilly day encouraged just over 40 riders to compete, and it may have been more if the main road to the venue had not been closed for roadworks just before the start! The chilly wind blowing across the start area disappeared once you dropped down into the sections, and the warm sunshine meant plenty of discarded jackets!

On the White (expert) route Eric Clarke returned to his winning ways beating younger rival Stuart Read for the first time in over a year. Eric rode at the front of the trial in order to get home for a family commitment and this seemed to have paid dividends as the sections got more slippery as the day wore on. Although every section was cleaned at least once during the day the climbs out of the stream at section 8 took marks on the later laps. Chris Dark had an excellent ride to clean this section on his fourth lap – the only white rider to do so.

The Inter riders compete over a 50:50 route of white and blue sections. This is supposed to be the four easiest white sections but on Sunday some scores were a little on the high side, so either all the whites were tough or the wrong sections were picked! However, the evergreen Danny Hastey made light work of them to end the day as a clear winner from Pete Jenkins. Lewis Taylor is improving week by week and whilst he found the going tough on Sunday did well to complete this difficult route.



The blue route was won overall by Scott Dark with the loss of 28 marks, but not far behind was Mike Blackman on his Beta. It was nice to see Mike riding again as he is returning to the sport after a few years layoff and will soon be back to his best. Good to see Dad back out again too! Another fast improving youngster, Karl Wooster, tied with Mike on 33 marks lost just ahead of (the not quite so young) Brian Flook and Chris Roos.

The red route was won by J. Yardley but with Stan Metcalf, on his Cub, not far behind. The youngsters also battled it out on this route with Emma Thompson just pipping Michael High. K Saxby just beat another youngster, Alex King, to take victory on the Yellow route.

All in all another great days sport provided by the RRND club, with a route for everyone and smiling faces at the end of the day. Nice to see the youngsters improving in every category and getting higher up the results. Hopefully this will bode well for the future of the club.

South Coast Group Trials

As many of you will have read in last months magazine a motion was proposed and passed at the AGM that we (RRND) formally beome a member club of the South Coast Group. As a rider who has ridden these trials in preference to Star Group, for several years, I have been asked to write a small piece on what the differences are and why people might be interested in riding their events.

Firstly, I'm sure people are going to ask why bother travelling further to events when the Star Group trials are organised so much 'closer to home'. Well, the answer to that depends on where you live! I live in Woldingham, which is near Junction 6 on the M25 and possibly one of the northernmost locations for club members, and find that my travelling times to most group events is normally between 30 minutes and an hour depending on the venue. The closest venue (for me) is probably at Don Barretts (yes the South Coast Group run a trial there) and the furthest would be either near Eastbourne or Elsted (near Petersfield) which is down the A3. In my experience this is not significantly different to travelling to Star Group venues, and at the end of the day what is an extra 10 minutes driving time when all things are taken into account?

The second question is likely to be 'what is the attraction of South Coast events?'. There are lots of answers to that one and a lot of it depends on what are your reasons for riding in trials?. Personally I enjoy a challenging course and find that the South Coast events tend to be harder than Star Group. I would recommend that anyone riding a South Coast event for the first time rides down a grade to what they would ride at our club trials. ie. If you ride whites at club events then ride the blue route, if you ride blue then ride red, and if you ride red then stay with red as these tend to be sensibly laid out and cater for all levels. There is also a green/yellow route for beginners too. The trials are nearly all enter on the day and thus it is quite normal for people to get there a bit early (usually 10:30 start but check in T&MX News) check out the sections and decide which route to ride before entering.

My second reason, and one which I feel is the major one which people should consider is the land which the South Coast Group have available to them. This months trial (April) is being held near Elsted which is a large open course on the South Downs with massive climbs up and down the side of the downs. The ride between sections is difficult to beat in the South East and worth the trip alone. If you have never used fourth gear in a dry section before then this is your chance! Other venues include some familiar to club members - Dons, Blacklands Farm, Faygate tip (although I don't recommend the latter!) and some great tracts of land available through the Eastbourne club which may not be as familiar. My favourite of these is the Horne Farm venue at Crowborough which is also used for the ACU SE centre club team trial. Those club members who have ridden in that event, or came along to watch will remember the lovely rocky stream sections that run throughout this venue.

Finally, the thing that I enjoy is the atmosphere of these events. With an average entry of 50-60 riders, and these fairly evenly distributed between the routes, there is always someone to ride around with and a lot of banter going on at the sections. The events tend to attract some of the Centres better riders and it is great to be able to watch them in action. Sam Connor rode the first round at Crowborough, in January, on his new Beta and gave a fantastic display to remain feet up on the White route. Other 'regulars' are Steven Foord, Adam Farley, Andy Blackman and Derek Tickner-Wand.

There will always be a few faces that you should recognise, myself, aforementioned Derek TW and son Phil and Bob Collins who often rides in our club trials. Next months trial (May) is held at Rome Woods and is the only South Coast Group which requires you to pre-enter. Entry forms are available on the Horsham Riders web site (www.hrc1.org) so hopefully I might see you there.....

Hazlemere Star Group trial 12th March

This trial is always harder than all the other group trials. So the night before most of us went to the dinner dance to prepare ourselves for a hard days ride. Luckily the trial was quite well laid out so I only scored 93. In the past I've always scored well over 120, and I'm not the only one as the red route is also rather hard. The weather on the day was dry but very cold. If it had rained then the scores would have mostly been 5's as the sections had no room to change to an easier alternative. Here are the scores of the brave RRND boys who took the challenge.

John Carrington over 50 red = 124. Nick Burr pre 67 red route = 101. Stan Metcalf pre 67 red route = 52. Keith Cross nov red route = 109. Peter Jenkins inter blue route = 93 Late entry *(no points for the club unfortunately)* Peter Penton expert white route = 78 Dave Radford over 50 red route = 26

Ouite a few of the sections were the sort where one small mistake or dab on the loose sandy soil would result in a 5 as the bike broke traction and instantly dug a massive hole with the back wheel. On section 14 a nice spectator filled in such a hole for me after the previous rider dug a good 2 footer on a steep climb that was already nearly impossible without the hole!. Strangely this was the only section I could do really well where no one else could get up the first climb. This only goes to prove that a Beta 270 with an IRC tyre can get more traction on loose surfaces than most other bikes. These tyres are available at Finns Motorcycles and in my opinion they are very good on most surfaces but rocks do cut them up a bit.

Directions: Follow the A25 from Reigate to Dorking, at the Betchworth roundabout go straight across. After half a mile there is a row of cottages on the right, the entrance is beside that last house. Follow the unmade road under the railway bridge.

Course: Five laps of eight sections with a break after two. It is preferred that riders ride the course as laps starting at which ever section they prefer and not keep riding a section continuously.

Sections: This trial will have four routes and there will be a break after two laps when sections may be changed.

General: Please note all Parents/Guardians are responsible for under 18 year old riders and it is required that you sign their entry form. Also schoolboy/girl riders do not have personal insurance cover, only third party. For safety

reasons it is preferred that riders do not ride around the course alone but in small groups observing each other in the sections. Always check that the section is clear before entering and no practicing before or during the trial in the sections, if caught practicing you may be disqualified.

Helmets are optional but you are strongly advised to wear one. All under 17 riders MUST wear a helmet!

This is an AMCA event run by Reigate & Redhill North Downs Motorcycle Club.
