Malcolm rode enduros on three successive weekends, two South-Eastern events sandwiching the two day "Natterjack" round of the British Enduro Championship.

The bike needed to be prepared for the first event and then tyres changed and everything set for the Natterjack with little prospect of much time for any repairs before the final SE event of the year which would decide placing in the SE Championship. Unfortunately a nasty ankle injury in the first event and the thought of two days riding the following weekend meant a DNF but Malcolm redeemed himself at the Natterjack being well placed in Clubman A and picking up a Gold Award. This was a particularly good result as few of the "clubmen" ride that class on home rounds; most ride expert or even championship. An even better result came last weekend with another Gold Award and second place in Clubman A, and a third place in the SE Championship. An excellent result for his first full year – but it does mean that he will now ride Expert in future SE events.

BMF Individual Membership

Is anyone interested in individual membership of the BMF?

The BMF have started a scheme to attract new 'individual' members to the organisation in order to strengthen the membership base and give the BMF more stability. Individual members have many added benefits over an affiliated member (which all Club members currently are through our affiliation). One advantage of individual membership is the receipt of the

'Motorcycle Rider' magazine which is one of the main communication routes to members.

Membership is currently £26 per year but there is now a discount of £5 when an affiliate member converts to an individual member, reducing this to £21 for the first year. In addition to this discount, the Club will also receive a payback of £5 to be used in reducing affiliation fees for the forthcoming year.

Club Trials - General Regulations

	Club trials may be either five laps of eight sections or four laps of ten sections. In both cases there will be a break after the second lap. It is preferred that riders ride the course as laps starting at whichever section they prefer and not keep riding the same section continuously.
General	Please note that all parents/people with parental authority are

responsible for under 18 year old riders and it is required that you sign their entry forms. Under 18s do not have personal insurance cover, only third party. For safety reasons do not ride around the course alone but in small groups observing each other in the sections. Always check a section is clear before entering and no practising in the sections before or during the trial. If caught practising you may be disqualified. Helmets are optional for adults but you are strongly advised to wear one. All under 18 riders MUST wear a helmet.

Club trials are AMCA events run by Reigate & Redhill North Downs Motorcycle Club.

Please remember to bring your Membership Card. If you cannot produce a current Membership Card, you will be charged as a guest rider - it is not the responsibility of the volunteer(s) undertaking the signing on to check whether you have renewed your membership.
